OSB Events and members of the TTP Cambridge Half Marathon team are committed to taking action to ensure that the event's impact on the wider community and environment are positive, wherever possible, and minimise any potentially negative impacts.

The ESG Statement outlined for 2023 and beyond, aligns with The Sustainable Development Goals set by the United Nations as part of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

This document outlines the initiatives associated with the CHM to encourage more sustainable methods of transport to the event, in addition to drawing the majority of participants from the local area. Key initiatives such as the free bicycle park with the event village and the Park and Ride (P&R) bus service are long established, and improvements to the existing schemes alongside new initiatives are being sought to improve the sustainability of the CHM. These will aid participants in travelling to the event on race day, whilst supporting the local environment and communities by discouraging private car use in Cambridge city centre.





PARK AND RIDE (P&R)

CHM partners with Stagecoach to operate a Park and Ride service to bring participants into the event village from 6 P&R sites around Cambridge and the wider area, growing from just 2 P&R sites at the inaugural CHM in 2012.

In 2022 approximately 25% of participants (approximately 2,500 people) used the P&R to travel to the event, saving at least 1,250 car journeys into the city centre on race day.

In partnership with the Local Authority, Stagecoach, who operate the P&R service for the CHM event are investing in their fleet of buses, with 30 electric buses entering the Cambridge area fleet from April 2023. This will mean that one third of the Stagecoach Cambridge bus fleet will be electric.



BICYCLE PARK

Free secure bike storage for 1,000 cycles has been available within the event village at every CHM since the inaugural event in 2012, to support those people wishing to travel to the start by bike. This provision continues for the 2023 event, supporting active and sustainable travel to the event village.
